Weekday Application Questions

I. EQUIP — Read the following from our doctrinal statement and study the supporting Scriptures: "<u>The Total Depravity of Man</u>. We believe that man was created in the image and likeness of God, but that in Adam's sin the race fell, inherited a sinful nature, became alienated from God, and is totally unable to regain its former position (Gen. 1.26; 3.1–24; Rom. 3.23; 5.12; Eph. 2.12)."

II. ENGAGE — Pastor Jace proposes that we add a statement of Anthropology to our Doctrinal Statement. Why is it important to understand both the dignity of humanity (anthropology) and the depravity of humanity (sinfulness)? How do these doctrines impact how you **ENGAGE** with people?

III. EXALT — Read Psalms 32 and 51 — David express his joy at God's forgiveness. If you cannot honestly say this is true in your life right now, go before the Lord and confess anything that might be impacting your fellowship with Him.
