

## 4) Weekday Application Questions

**EQUIP**— Compare and contrast Nebuchadnezzar (chapter 4) with Belshazzar (chapter 5). How does Belshazzar's response to God differ from Nebuchadnezzar's? 4) Weekday Application Questions
