



## **Weekday Application Questions**

- a) **EQUIP** Read Daniel 7:9-14 and Daniel 10. What similarities do you see in these passages with Revelation 1? Also, take note of Revelation 1:9, which provides the basic outline of the Book of Revelation. "Things which you have seen" (Rev. 1), "Things which are" (Rev. 2-3), and "Things which will take place" (Rev. 4-22).
- **b) ENGAGE** Why was John on Patmos? What is your understanding of the Bible's teaching on suffering?
- c) **EXALT** From the Gospels, we know that John had a close relationship with Jesus. Imagine what it might have been like for John to see Jesus as depicted in Revelation 1:12-16. What emotions do you think John felt in that moment? Why?
- **d)** Here is your "One Thing" for this week: How should John's vision of Jesus affect your life? What does it say about Jesus and His presence among His churches? Does your life reflect a "Revelation 1:17" response to Jesus?
