

How do the cries of the lost in the sixth seal ("hide us from the wrath of the Lamb") show the foolishness of waiting to believe in Jesus?
- c) EXALT How can we take comfort in knowing that God's judgment is righteous and just? How can the knowledge of coming judgment increase your gratitude for salvation?
- d) Here is your "One Thing" for this week: Since believers will not experience this wrath, how should that shape our worship and devotion to God? How can we balance the urgency of warning unbelievers about future judgment with the hope and joy we have as believers?
