

Weekday Application Questions

- a) EQUIP As you reflect on Revelation 11, what stands out to you as being particularly helpful, insightful, or difficult to grasp? How does this story of the Two Witnesses fit within the overall structure of Revelation? How does the seventh trumpet (v.15) signal a turning point in the judgment sequence and the unveiling of the kingdom
- **b) ENGAGE** What traits of the witnesses might we strive to embody in our lives as we share our faith? What practical steps can you take to be a faithful witness in your own context, similar to the witnesses in this passage?
- c) EXALT What evidence do you see in the world today that we are still awaiting Jesus' Kingdom that things today are not the way that they are supposed to be? What does it stir in you to know that even when evil appears to win (vv.7–10), God still writes the final word?
- d) Here is your "One Thing" for this week: As Christians we know that "The Lion is on the Move," i.e., that one day, Jesus will return to rule and reign as King of kings. How can you live today in response to that future promise Begin memorizing Revelation 11:15-18 as a way to anchor your hope in Christ's coming kingdom.
