

## 5) Weekday Application Questions

- a) EQUIP Trace the storyline of God dwelling with man from Genesis to Revelation. From Eden, to the tabernacle, to the incarnation, to the Spirit, to the New Jerusalem—how does this biblical thread reshape your understanding of the whole story of Scripture?
