4) Weekday Application Questions:

- a) **EQUIP** Trace the storyline of the major covenants. Read Genesis 15 (Abrahamic), 2 Samuel 7 (Davidic), and Jeremiah 31 (New). How does each covenant point toward God's dwelling with His people? Write down one promise that is fulfilled in Christ.
- b) **ENGAGE** People all around you feel restless and homeless chasing belonging through success, relationships, or possessions. When you hear someone express that ache, gently point them to Christ: "I know that longing too but it's really a longing for God, our true home." Share how Jesus has satisfied your deepest longing.
- c) **EXALT** When we gather on Sunday, remember: this isn't routine; it's a foretaste of forever. Before you walk into worship, pause and pray: "Lord, thank You that You dwell with us now by Your Spirit. Help me worship today as one who longs for the day when You will dwell with us face to face.
- d) Here is your "One Thing" for this week: Whenever you feel unsettled this week frustrated at work, restless in your house, anxious in your circumstances don't ignore that thought. Instead, let it remind you of God's promise: My deepest longing is His presence, my guarantee is Jesus, and my final home is dwelling with Him forever.
