4) Weekday Application Questions:

a) EQUIP — How does Paul's example challenge your definition of success? Which of the first five characteristics (serving the Lord, teaching the truth, following the Holy Spirit, finishing the course, or living with innocence) do you most need to cultivate in your own walk with Christ?

b) ENGAGE — Paul's ministry was fueled by the gospel of grace (v. 24). Who in your life needs to hear that same message of faith in the Lord Jesus Christ (v. 21)? What would it look like to speak truth with both courage and compassion this week?

c) EXALT — How does this passage lead you to worship Christ, the Chief Shepherd who gave His life for the flock?

d) Here is your "One Thing" for this week: Don't just attend church — let yourself be shepherded in the church. Through our Shepherding Initiative, every person at Grace will be intentionally known, prayed for, and cared for. This is your invitation — to be part of a church where shepherds love, listen, and walk with you through every season of life.
