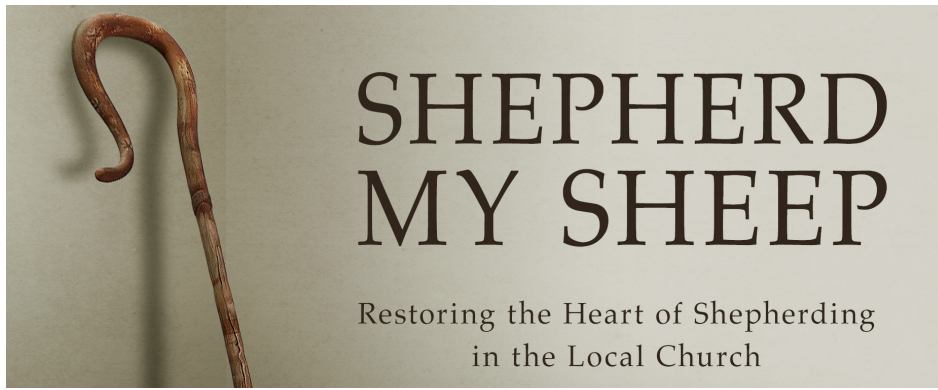

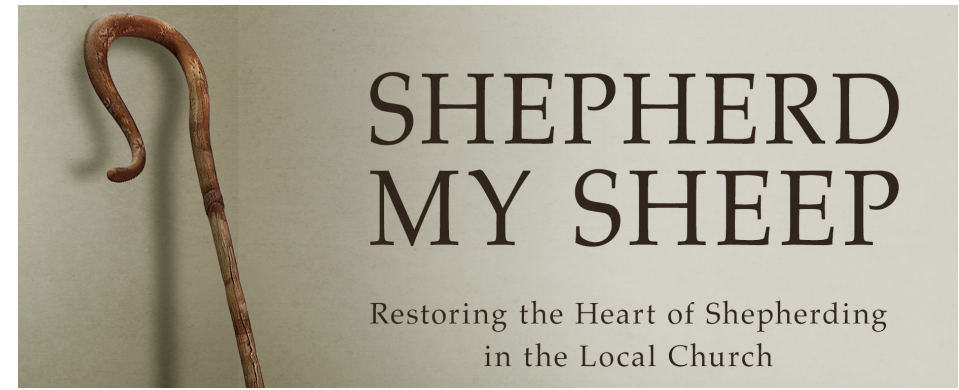

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3) Weekday Application Questions:

a) EQUIP — Which of the Ten Characteristics of a Successful Shepherd stands out to you the most? Why?

b) ENGAGE — What are some unique challenges to this vision of shepherding in our Dallas culture? What can you do to help overcome these challenges? Maybe it's by reaching out to someone who seems disconnected, inviting a neighbor to dinner, or simply slowing down enough to listen to someone's story.

c) EXALT— Spend time this week in worship, thanking Jesus that He is your Good Shepherd. Read Psalm 23 or John 10 out loud and make it your prayer. Let His care for you shape your care for others.

d) Here is your "One Thing" for this week: Play your part in helping Grace become a church where everyone is shepherded, where no one is unseen, unloved, or unequipped — where each of us cares for people the way Jesus cares for us.

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
