## 5) Weekday Application Questions

**a) EQUIP** — Compare and contrast Numbers 13—14 and Joshua 2. What has changed after forty years? How is the new generation ready to obey God and enter the Promised Land?

**b) ENGAGE** — Who in your life might seem “unlikely” to respond to the gospel — and how does Rahab reshape your expectations? Reconsider one person or situation you’ve written off, and bring it before the Lord, asking Him to show you where His mercy and lovingkindness may still be at work.

**c) EXALT**— What attributes of God are most clearly revealed through Rahab’s story and speech? How do the concepts of herem (“utterly destroy”) and hesed (“deal kindly”) work together in Joshua 2?

**d) Here is your “One Thing” for this week:** This week, prayerfully consider how God may be inviting you to respond in faith as our church seeks to move forward in obedience through Built on Truth—trusting God’s character even as we humbly seek His will, without waiting to see the outcome first.
